ADDS SOME PRINCESSES TO THE ROYAL FAMILY.

More About the Claims of Mrs. Pratt and Her Heirs to the Crown Lands.

Don Caesar Moreno is still to the fore and is out with counter claims against the ex-Queen, in the Wash-The Don adds a few ington Post. Princesses to the royal family, but the more the merrier. The article in question is headed "A Battle for Mil-

linos," and runs in part as follows:
"Ex-Queen Liliuokalani is to mee with the determined opposition of rival claimants to the so-called crown lands of the Hawaiian Islands. It will not only be necessary for her to convince Congress that the United States Government should make her some remuneration for these lands, but that she and no one else is the rightful owner of them before she can recover or have the title vested in her. The other claimants to these lands are Princess Elizabeth Kekna-niau, the wife of F. S. Pratt, an American from Massachusetts, who went to the Hawaiian Islands in the early days and like Mr. Dominis, of the same Commonwealth, married in-to the native royal family of the little island kingdom, and Princess Teresa Owana Kaohelani. The latter is the nicce of Princess Kekaaniau, Mrs Pratt, and married a native Hawaiian with the Americanized name of Rob ert W. Wilcox. These two Hawalian ladies assert that they and not the ex-Queen are entitled to remuneration from the United State Government for the so-called crown lands. They have already taken steps to present their claims against those of Mrs. Dominis before Congress, and will make a stubborn fight for recognition and remuneration.

The claims of Princess Kekaaniau and Princess Koahelelani to the crown lands of the Hawaiian throne are based upon statements, substantiat ed by genealogists, that they are the only living members of the royal fam-New Republic Building., Honolalu H I. ily of the Kamehamehas of Hawaii.

"The value of these lands is now estimated at about \$6,000,000, but it is confidently expected that in the course of a few years, with the Isl-ands as a part of the United States and the anticipated growth of population and trade, they will quadruple in value. The principal holdings are in the Islands of Oahu, upon which the city of Honolulu is located; Maui Molokai, Hawaii, and Kauai, The most valuable portion of the lands lie within the city limits of Honolulu. and they are to a considerable extent improved, although little or no rents have been paid upon them Large tracts in the other Islands are de-voted to the production of sugar, and have for years been a part of the enormous land holdings of Claus Spreckels, the sugar king of Hawaii. Should the ex-Queen be decreed the rightful owners of these lands, or be awarded compensation for them by the United States Government, Sprecels will continue to hold the land, as he has for years, without the pay-ment of any rent except what he has voluntarily contributed to her.
"The former Queen is now in Wash

ington, and it is said that she is being supported by Spreckels, and her in-terests and claims to the crown lands are being looked after by Paul Neu-man, the chief lieutenant of the Hawaiian multi-millionaire. Her case is being prepared for presentation to the Court of Claims, while the rival claimof San Francisco.
